Washington 2006 Update 15 Released with Latest Schedule, Appearance and Auction Information

Washington 2006, the world philatelic exhibition scheduled for May 27 to June 3 at the Washington, DC Convention Center, has issued its 15th Member Update. It may be viewed and downloaded on the show's web site at http://www.washington-2006.org.

The complete schedule of activities and events takes up nine of its ten pages. It contains many new listings and several date, time, and room number changes.

Show visitors can meet with a race car driver, an astronaut, local radio DJs, collectible specialists, numerous stamp artists, and colorful characters throughout all eight days of Washington 2006.

NASCAR Busch series champion David Green will autograph your souvenirs on Tuesday, May 30 between 10 AM-12 PM and 1 PM-3 PM. The USPS race car simulator can be driven by "big kids" and adults daily between 10:30 AM-12:30 PM and 2:30-5:30 PM.

Former NASA astronaut Henry (Hank) Hartsfield, Jr. will be at Washington 2006 on Technology Day, Wednesday, May 31, signing autographs from 1 PM-2 PM in the Kids Zone. He is a veteran of three missions logging 483 hours total in space on Shuttles Columbia (STS-4 in 1982), Discovery (STS-41D in 1984) and Challenger (STS-61A in 1985).

The American Stamp Dealers Association welcomes members of the public to their daily "What's in Your Attic?" service. Stamps, covers, postcards, stock and bond certificates, and other paper collectibles can be brought in for expert evaluations by specialists in those areas. Radio station 98.7 WMZQ Country is a co-sponsor of the service.

The U.S. Postal Service has invited several of its stamp designers to attend Washington 2006 and participate in autograph sessions. They
