## PCI COURT CASES UPDATE

Philatelic Congress of India (PCI) has filed an appeal against the judgment of Civil Judge Gautam Manan of August 4, 2005. The Judge held that the PCI failed to hold free and fair elections on August 25, 2002 and decreed for the relief of the perpetual injunction restraining PCI from holding elections without proper accounts being rendered for the previous year and without the independent observer.

## POSTAL THEME FOR DURGA PUJA

The Durga Puja at Labony Estate, Salt Lake, Kolkata chose postal evolution, as the theme in its 31st year of celebration. The venue itself was modeled in replica of an old post office building and had a collage of postage stamps on its boundary wall. In fact, the theme of the Labony Puja was a tribute to the Indian Postal System, celebrating its 150 years.

The organizers, while explaining their choice of the theme, pointed out an interesting connection between the postal systems and the pujas. The daker saaj of the idols used to be delivered like post (in Bengali daak) in ships from Germany. Hence, this attire of the idols came to be known as daker saaj.

Conceived by Somnath Mukherjee, the puja venue displayed a historical journey since the time of rock-carvings to the modern SMS system. The exhibits show the different ways of sending messages like the shaven heads of slaves, pigeons, runners and messengers. The earliest post-man was the runner who had to travel for miles on foot, to deliver letters, braving many adversities. Later, Sher Shah Suri started the "Horse Messaging Service", involving messengers on horse-back. Gradually, with the advent of the Industrial Revolution, came the steam- engine which made the postal system more convenient and speedy. Eventually, the arrival of the air-mail revolutionized the entire postal system. The pandal has portrayed this transition to a stunning effect and a suitable lighting has recreated the mood to its perfection.

Durga Puja is the biggest festival in West Bengal celebrated with great fervor a month before Deepavali – the festival of lights. Large tents are erected in several localities of every city and festivities go on for days.

GREG MANNING IS NOW ESCALA

Greg Manning Auctions, Inc. announced on September 28, 2005 that the Company has changed its corporate name to Escala Group, Inc. Escala Group has established its new corporate headquarters in mid-town Manhattan, New York.

These companies position us as a global powerhouse in the collectibles market. Our businesses now include Auctions, Merchant/Dealer Operations and Trading, all of which will operate under the Escala Group umbrella. Our new name reflects the evolution of our company and is an integral part of the implementation of our overall growth strategy. Going forward, under the capable leadership of Jose Miguel, we look to expand our presence and market share worldwide."

Mr. Perez continued, "Mr. Manning's new responsibilities include a special dedication to the Asian market and the opportunities that it presents, especially in Hong Kong and the People's Republic of China, both for developing the market of philatelic auctions and exploring the possibilities of developing businesses related to philately."

Prior to that, he was the Managing Director and Country Head, Iberia, of the Bank of America, N.A. in Madrid. Mr. del Valle-Iturriaga has a BA in Law from the University of Deusto (Bilbao) and a BA in Business Administration from ICADE University in Madrid.
