NEW STAMPS RELEASED

India Post issued a commemorative postage stamp to mark the World Consumer Rights Day on March 15, 2006 in the denomination of Rupees five.

US President John F Kennedy gave a landmark speech on March 15, 1962. The speech was made to the US Congress where he first outlined four basic consumer rights - right to satisfaction of basic needs; right to safety; right to be informed; right to choose. This was landmark step for the protection of consumer rights worldwide. Later, the consumer movement gained recognition for four more consumer rights - right to be heard; right to redress; right to consumer education & right to a healthy environment.

In 1983 the UN formally declared 15 March as World Consumer Rights Day. Then on April 9, 1985 the UN General Assembly adopted the United Nations Guidelines for Consumer Protection.

World Consumer Rights Day is an annual occasion for celebration and solidarity within the international consumer movement. But more importantly it is a time for promoting the basic rights of all consumers, for demanding that those rights are respected and protected, and for protesting the market abuses and social injustices which undermine them.

India has been observing 15 March since 1989 as the National Consumers' Day. The Department of Consumer Affairs in the Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution, is the nodal Department in the Central Government to deal with the various matters related to the protection and welfare of the consumers in the country.

Suresh Kumar designed the Stamp and the First Day Cover. Alka Sharma designed the pictorial first day postmark. Brochure containing write-up and technical data was issued on the occasion. The First Day Cover and the

Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. India Security Press printed the stamps by Photo Gravure in the quantity of 0.8 million in sheets of 35.

INDIAN PARTICIPATION IN EXHIBITIONS ABROAD

International philatelic exhibitions are competitions between philatelic exhibits from all over the world or continent. Your exhibit competes with the best in its class. Just getting accepted as a participant by the organizers is an achievement in itself and getting a medal transcends all personal achievement and adds to the glory of your organization, and the nation. Therefore we urge all those who are eligible to participate in forthcoming exhibitions and bring laurels to India.

All those exhibits that have previously participated in an international exhibition and won an award in last 10 years are eligible.

A new exhibit (not the exhibitor) must have received a minimum of 75 points (70 points in Age Groups A and B of Youth class) in a national exhibition within the last 10 years.

No previous award is necessary for Literature class, One Frame and Open class. However the exhibits in One Frame and Open class should be good enough to be in a world exhibition.

The entry in Championship class requires three Large Gold Medals (or has obtained 95 or more points) in three different years within ten years starting from the year in which the exhibitor won his/her first Large Gold Medal.

It is advisable to have good understanding of FIP Statutes, GREX, GREV's and SREVs and Guidelines for better results at the exhibitions. These are available at the International Philatelic Federation's (FIP) website at http://www.f-i-p.ch.

There are two shows this year where participation is still open for exhibitors from India. The first is the ESPANA 06 world philatelic exhibition to be held at Malaga, Spain from October 7 to 13, 2006. ESAPNA 06 provides an opportunity to participate in all classes, viz. Championship

Class, Traditional Philately, Revenue, Postal History, Postal Stationery, Aerophilately, Astrophilately, Thematic Philately, Maximaphily, Youth Philately, Literature, Open Class and One Frame Class.

The Entry fees are 30 Euros (Rs 1600 approximately) per frame for all classes except in Literature Class it is 30 Euros per exhibit and entries in Youth Philately are free of charge. In the Championship class Swiss Frank 100 per frame will be charged in addition to 30 Euros.

The last date for sending the entry forms to the national commissioner is March 23, 2006. Although Bulletin 1 and entry forms have now arrived from Spain it is better to download the Entry Forms and Regulations of ESPANA 06 including special regulations for One Frame and Open class available at http://www.stampsofindia.com/newssite/newspost/espana_06.htm

The next show later this year is DUBAI 06 the 19th Asian international which we have covered in Issue # 259 of February 9, 2006. DUBAI 06 will be held from November 13 to 16, 2006 at Dubai, United Arab Emirates. This is a specialized show and will cover Traditional, Postal History, One Frame and Literature Classes.

Further details and availability of Bulletin 1 and forms shall be reported as soon as announced.

POINTS TO PONDER

Life is full of ironies. It's something that almost every one in this world can attest to. Often the last thing we want to do in our life is what we exactly end up doing at one point or the other. Some people attribute it to destiny, some to Karma, some just say that's life & live with it! However, it's always encouraging to think that even ironies can have a silver lining hidden in them if we look on the bright side of life.

Last year was full of philatelic exhibitions in India, but these were held only at District Level and couple of them at Circle or Regional Level. So many Philatelic Clubs & Societies of India can organise such exhibitions in much more better ways, if I am not wrong. The reason is well-known to all of

us and can be read in these columns of some previous issues. The Postal Department is least bothered, if collectors are visiting such exhibitions or not. They are simply bothered to complete their file with much paperwork. At present no one knows in India, when we all will see the next Official National Exhibition. This is only possible, when the Postal Department decides about holding such exhibition. It is also bad luck for collectors of some states or circles in which State or Regional Level Exhibitions have not been organised since a long time. A very good example can be given of The Bengal Circle Philatelic Exhibition, which was organised at Kolkata after the lapse of a considerable time.

Earlier, due to recent policies of The Postal Department in connection with the special cancellations adapted for all First Day Issues at Regional Head Quarters, we all are after collecting various varieties of First Day Cancellations. But it may sound strange to all of us, when I say, that the Postal Department has decided to provide us with varieties of new stamps also. Recently issued set of four stamps on President's Fleet Review, Visakhapatnam, is a genuine example of this feat. Yet The Postal Department has banned the display Errors, Freaks and Varieties in India is another story.

Such varieties of cancellations and stamps badly confuse thematic collectors in particular. What do you think about the treatment of such varieties of cancellations and stamps in your thematic collection and what role they play in improving the standard of your collection? Do write to us frankly your own views on this topic, so that we may share your views along with other readers.

When other countries of the world are engaged in finalising their new stamp issues for the years 2007 & 2008, India is yet to announce their issue programme for the current year 2006. So I think it is high time for The Postal Dept. of India to ponder over these issues.

I know that in India there are so many collectors who can write and explain their views on such points, but due to some ego or other type of reservations they do not express what they think and prefer to remain good silent readers only. Is it good for the future of philately? By keeping such attitude are we going to help in flourishing this king of hobbies? I think it is the right time for all of us to think over this subject and decide ourselves.

With this issue (of ITS Stamp News), we are entering in ninth year of publication of this issue and this is only, due to regular support from all of you. I hope to get your support in much more better way in future to keep this journal regular and more interesting for all of you.
