NEWS & ANNOUNCEMENTS

SERVICE TAX ON POSTAL SERVICES

Consequent to enactment of the Finance act on April 18, 2006, the Central Board of Excise & Customs imposed Service Tax on some of the services provided by India Post with effect from June 1, 2006. India Post passed the entire burden to the consumers and a 12.24% Service Tax is now being collected on Speed Post, Express Parcel Post, Logistics Post, all types of Money Orders, Bill Mail Service, Western Union Money Transfer, Postal Life Insurance, all other time sensitive mail services, and Agency services.

All Head Post Offices in the country, about 850 in number, were asked to register with the respective Commissioner of Service Tax by May 30, 2006.

The software that operates the tens-of-thousands computers at the postal counters is yet to be updated and meanwhile the amount of the Service Tax is being noted on the back of the receipt, signed and postmarked with the date stamp. Many post offices are using rubber stamps for this purpose.

The philatelists and postal historians would be happy if the rubber stamp or its equivalent is also applied to the mail articles and or the tax is collected through postage stamps!

STAMP EXHIBITION IN TRAIN

A new record was set on the rail tracks at Siliguri Junction on June 5, 2006 when for the first time in India and across the globe, a running philatelic exhibition was conducted.

The Darjeeling Himalayan Railway, UNESCO recognized world heritage, ran for 31 kilometers in 10 hours from was from Siliguri Junction to Agony Point, with a halt at Sukuna to mark its 125th year. The program jointly conducted by Siliguri Philatelic Society (SPS) and Sikkim Philatelic Club (SPC) had added a new page in the history of Indian Philately. Noted Railway Philatelist Vikas Singh of Ghaziabad, the man behind the concept, had booked the train for the day for this purpose.

The event named "Heritage 06" was held on June 5 and 6, 2006. On first day the exhibition was held at Siliguri Junction Railway Station where the well decorated Train 788-B was flagged off to Agony Point, Tindharia at around 7.30 am. Stamps, Special Cover and First Day Covers on Indian Railway mounted on 40 sheets were exhibited inside the two bogies of the toy train. Present on the occasion was K B Chursa, Superintendent of Post Offices Jalpaiguri Post Office, Dipok Dey - eminent philatelist from Kolkata, Vikas Singh, noted railway philatelist from Ghaziabad, S K Biswas President of Siliguri Philatelic Society, Shital Pradhan Secretary Sikkim Philatelic Club, Postal and Railway officials and the philatelists Chiranjiv Chakraborty, Biswajit Bhattacharya, Padam Parajuli, Sumnima Parajuli, all from Siliguri, Ganesh Pradhan and Shishir Pradhan from from Sikkim while Asit Ghosh and Manoranjan Bhattacharya represented Cooch Bihar Philatelic Association.

Shital Pradhan conducted the program in the running train. Biswas welcome all aboard and told the passengers on board the significance of the achievement of the day. He added that this event held in a small platform will generate enough curiosity in India and the other parts of the World. Pawan Aggarwal, Secretary, SPS also addressed the audience. Dipok Dey conducted a workshop on philately explained the beauty of the stamp and how can a beginner generate this hobby to its commercial use too.

A special cover and a stamp booklet were released on this occasion by the Chief Guest K B Chursa, who presented the first Special Cover to Vikas Singh.

The next phase of the function was held at Denabandhu manch. A stamp exhibition with over 2000 stamps was displayed followed by painting exhibition and quiz competition.

Both the associations of SPS and SPC are making efforts to mark the achievement recognized by entry in the Limca Book of Records and the Guinness Book of Records.

151 YEARS OF INDIA POST

The Chief Postmaster General of Karnataka Circle of India Post has published an address book to celebrate the 151 Years of India Post. The address book priced at Rs 130 is hardbound and includes about 60 pages profusely illustrated in multicolor of information on postal history, philately and post office along with 100 pages for addresses.

INDIA POST & MULTI COMMODITIES EXCHANGE OF INDIA India Post will soon tie up with the Multi Commodities Exchange of India (MCX) to provide farmers an opportunity to do business in the futures market and to enable farmers and traders in commodities to eliminate middlemen and reap maximum profits from their produce. Jalgaon, one of the major trading centers situated in north Maharashtra, has been chosen to start this venture.

MCX would set up the required infrastructure, including trading price boards and Internet-enabled computer systems introducing an online screen-based spot trading platform for buying and selling of farm produce at Jalgaon. MCX may charge a nominal fee from farmers and traders to access online trading prices.
