NEW STAMPS RELEASED

INDRAPRASTHA GIRLS SCHOOL

The Chief Postmaster General of Delhi Circle, S Samant, released a postage stamp to commemorate Indraprastha Girls School New Delhi on July 8, 2006 in the denomination of Rs 5. Kapila Vatsyayan, who graduated from the school, presided over the function while Minister for Science and Technology Kapil Sibal was the chief guest.

In the late 19th and early 20th century, modern education was yet to reach the women of India, when a small band of enthusiasts decided to establish a school in Old Delhi on May 21, 1904.

A brainchild of freedom fighter-educationist Annie Besant, the school owes its origin to an idea for an exclusive girls school in Delhi, mooted by Dr Besant in a meeting of the Delhi branch of the Theosophical Society of India in 1903.

The first school for girls in Delhi, Indraprastha Girls' School, had begun with just seven students on its rolls. Lala Jugal Kishore, an executive in a British firm and a theosophist, was the foremost of the founders who went from house to house to collect funds and convince hesitant parents to send their daughters to school. Advocate Raj Pearey Lal, Lala Sultan Singh Rais, Seth Banwari Lal Lohiya, Lala Pearey Lal (Motorwale), and Rai Bishamber Nath were the other founder members.

It is nestled in an 1857 Haveli close to the Jama Masjid in old Delhi that was provided by Lala Balkrishan Das, a man of wealth, a theosophist, and a founder member of the school. This building is now declared a heritage building by the government.

The 102-year-old school was also the first to teach girls from an Indian perspective. School had been visited by Dr Besant and Ravaindra Natrh Tagore and its alumni includes Kamla Nehru, wife of Jawaharlal Nehru.

Indraprastha College, the city's first college for women, also began in the third floor of the school in 1924, before it was shifted to the Civil Lines in 1936.

VOORHEES COLLEGE, VELLORE

The Minister of Communication and Information Technology, Dayanidhi Maran released a postage stamp to commemorate Voorhees College, Vellore on July 10, 2006 in the denomination of Rs 5.

Arcot Mission College affiliated to the University of Madrasoorhees College is one of the oldest institutions of our nation. Former President of India, Dr S Radhakrishnan was its alumni.

The origin of the institution can be traced back to 1895 when the old Arcot Academy at Ranipet and Church of Scotland Mission High School were amalgamated and renamed the Arcot Mission High School which was later upgraded of the status of an Intermediate College. In 1898 it became Arcot Mission College affiliated to the University of Madras. In 1905 the foundation stone of the present building was laid and Ralph Voorhees of USA donated 25000 dollars. The name of the college was chamged after the donor's wife, Elizabeth R Voorhees College.

The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. India Security Press printed the stamps by Photo Gravure in the quantity of 0.8 million.

THE VELLORE MUTINY 1806

The Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu, M Karunanidhi released a postage stamp to commemorate the bicentenary of the Vellore Mutiny on July 10, 2006 in the denomination of Rs 5 at Vellore. The Minister of Communication and Information Technology, Dayanidhi Maran was present at the function.

A mutiny is collective disobedience and violation of military discipline by enlisted men. It results from loss of faith and trust between the leaders and the led. Disregard for the soldier's well-being, arising from the expanding commercial and profit needs of the East India Company, prepared the ground for many a Mutiny.

In November 1805, it was decreed that soldiers would no longer wear caste marks, and would change to wearing headdress akin to that of the British. There were other reasons for resentment: changes in pay and permission to keep families, the use of soldiers for menial duties, and doing away with the appointments of senior Indians known as `Black Commandants'

Realizing the anger this had caused, the Commander-in-Chief of Madras Army, Sir John Craddock, advised Bentinck, Governor of Madras, to cancel the orders. The 32-year-old Bentinck refused.

The troops, seething under the orders perceived as unjust and affecting their religious practices, and angry at inconsiderate officers, decided to march to Vellore and free Tipu Sultan's sons. In the process they killed British officers, and shot sick British soldiers in their hospital beds. On reaching the Fort, they nearly took control of it from the outnumbered British. One British survivor escaped to bring the news to Arcot. An enterprising officer rushed to Vellore with a small number of British troops, blasted his way into the Fort with gunfire, and rounded up the rebels. About 800 Madras Army soldiers were killed and shot. Nearly a hundred soldiers were blown up by tying them to guns.

On the other hand, Governor Bentinck was recalled. Even more important, new rules prohibiting tampering with soldiers' religious and social customs were issued. The flogging of soldiers, which was common, was abolished.

Sankha Samanta designed the Stamp and the First Day Cover. Alka Sharma designed the pictorial first day postmark. Brochure containing write-up and technical data was issued on the occasion. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. Security Printing Press Hyderabad printed the stamps by Wet Offset in the quantity of 0.8 million.

GETTING CREATIVE ON EBAY

Miniature sheet turns into a FDC in a matter of two months. That's exactly what an Indian stamp dealer did, he bought a Nicaragua 1980 Miniature Sheet that depicts Mahatma Gandhi and Taj Mahal in mint condition from a German seller on eBay in May 2006 and the same buyer in July 2006 was spotted selling the same sheet on eBay now sitting pretty on a First Day Cover. Unfortunately he seemed to have forgotten that these sheets are individually numbered and the number is clearly visible in both the cases. When questioned about the item the listing was ended early.

Those who would like to see the evidence of this creative workmanship may check eBay item # 9514937248 - mint and item # 230005866386 - FDC. So next time you are eying that lovely FDC / cover make sure it is not the recent creation of an unethical seller.

NEW DIRECTOR GENERAL OF INDIA POST

Jyotsna Diesh, has taken over as Secretary, Department of Posts and Director General (Posts) on the afternoon of Jun 30, 2006, subsequent to the retirement of Dr U Srinivasa Raghavan. She belongs to 1969 batch of Indian Postal Service. Prior to this appointment, she was working as Member Postal Services Board. She had worked in key assignments including Chief Post Master General, Delhi Circle from 2002 to 2005. Earlier she worked in National Project Construction Corporation.

COMMEMORATIVE COMPUTER GENERATED LABELS

Since 1991 India Post is utilizing computers to book registered and speed post mails, money orders, and several other transactions. These are known as Multi Purpose Counter Machines (MPCM). Prior to their introduction post office used to have dedicated windows for a particular type of service only. With MPCM the consumer can go to any window for any transaction.

The computer generates a receipt for the consumer and a label for the article of mail. This label replaces postage stamps or franking as well as the registration label. It keeps track of the amount of postage paid in cash or in stamps or in franking and processes the details of article.

The receipts are also innovatively used for special and commemorative messages in the last line that can be customized by the operator. Several operators do not take the trouble to insert anything but some obviously do. We see messages such as "Have a Nice Day" commonly. However we know that there are several interesting messages waiting to be discovered by the philatelists. We request readers in India to find out what is messages is being used on the postal computers in your town.
