No Dates Announced Yet National Parks Set of 5 is expected next issue

New issues along with the First Day Cover and the information sheet, at Rs 2 each, are put on sale on sale at nearly 1000 selected Post Offices including all Philatelic Bureaus and Philatelic Counters in India.

NEW STAMPS RELEASED

India Post released a set of six commemorative postage stamps in the denomination of

Rs 5 each, on Gautama Buddha on May 2, 2007.

The stamps depict a statue from the Gandhara period when Buddha was a prince; a sculpture from Myanmar where he is an ascetic, a meditating Buddha image from Sarnath, Bhumisaparsha Buddha holding the nectar of immorality in a jar, incarnations of Buddha, and Lotus - a Hinayana Symbol and Dharma Chakra.

Bharti Mirchandani designed the Stamps and the First Day Cover. Alka Sharma designed

the pictorial first day postmark. Brochure containing write-up and technical data was issued on the occasion. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. India Security Press, Nasik printed the stamps by potogravure in the quantity of 0.6 million each. The Miniature Sheet was printed in the quantity of 0.4 million.

RECENT SPECIAL POSTMARKS & COVERS

Nawanagar Philatelic Society, Jamnagar brought out two picture post cards on April 1, 2007 to mark the 50 years of Decimal currency. These beautifully produced cards are priced at Rs 40 per set.

ARMY POSTAL SERVICE ISSUES

Further to our report in Issue #284 of March 22, 2007 we now have more information on the newly launched product, the Field Postal Orders.

These are available in 6 denominations, Rs 2,000, Rs 3,000, Rs 5,000, Rs 10,000, Rs 15,000 and Rs 20,000. The commission chargeable per postal order is Rs 30, Rs 30, Rs

50, Rs 60, Rs 80, and Rs 90 respectively. Thus the collector aspiring for a set needs to fork out Rs 55,340 about Euro 1,000 (US\$ 1350)!!!

The primary purpose in introducing this product was to provide a convenient, safe, and economical method to the soldiers especially those on duty in remote areas, for remitting money home.

NEW COLLECTOR PACKS

This is to clarify that only the 2004 FDC pack is available now at the Philatelic Bureau, New Delhi and the remaining packs as reported in the previous issue are expected to be available in a month s time. The 2004 FDC pack is being sent from New

Delhi to all bureaus.

Since last year the making of collectors pack of stamps, not FDC, is decentralized and each Philatelic Bureau prepares its share of packs. Thus it will be available at

different dates at different Philatelic Bureaus.

#### AUCTION ACTION

Harmers  $\underline{\text{http://www.harmers.com/}}$  is holding an auction sale on May 22, 2007 at London. It has some interesting Indian items.

Undoubtedly the star attraction is an incredible block of sixty (10 x 6) of the  $1854\,$ 

Prepared For Used But Not Issued 9 Arches anna Deep Vermilion, the rare shade, the lower half of the sheet with marginal inscriptions and Plate number 1?at right,

unused without gum. It has a red oval Received Via Southampton 3 JUL 1854 ?handstamp on the reverse. It is cataloged at £84,000+ and estimated here at £50,000.

An unused block of ten (5 x 2) from the lower-left corner of the sheet in Vermillion

is estimated at £5,000.

An unmounted mint example of King George V Re 1 Head Omitted, a very striking variety, with BPA certificate (1994) and a Catalog value of £5,000 is estimated at £1,750.

There are two Red Scinde Dawks estimated at  $\pm 4,000$  and  $\pm 10,000$ , a White Scinde Dawk at  $\pm 1,000$ , 1855 1 anna Die III horizontal strip of 4 used in 1857 on a cover to Brighton at  $\pm 1,250$ , Jammu & Kashmir 1879 " anna Bisect on combination cover to Amritsar at  $\pm 3,000$ , and Jind 1882 " anna Feudatory issue used in combination with British India on a cover to Bombay at  $\pm 1,000$ .

1948, Mahatma Gandhi issued stamps 1" anna, 3" anna and 12 anna singles, and Rupees 10 block of four, affixed to Helio Courvoisier page with what is described as a previously unrecorded italic Specimen?overprint, is estimated at £5,000. This appears to be the same item that is illustrated on page 184 in the Gandhi Handbook by Manik Jain and Mrinal Kanti Roy where it described as Printers specimen. This Specimen handstamp in our opinion has nothing to do with Courvoisier but has been added by some unscrupulous person to enhance its marketability.

# David Feldman & the Courvoisier Archives

At least one postal administration has raised objections to recent sale of the Courvoisier Archives by the Feldman. Although Feldman in smartly drafted letter described these items as technical proofs that postal administrations may allow printers to keep, it is still open to interpretation regarding ownership and their disposal. Dr Ottaviano Rossi, Director of Azienda Autonoma di Stato Filatelica e Numismatica, Republic of San Marino wrote to David Feldman on April 18, 2007.

Feldman were also careful by not selling the Swiss and Liechtenstein section of the Courvoisier Archives. Let s watch the developments.
